I. The story of the birth of Moses.



⁸ Eventually, a new king came to power in Egypt who knew nothing about Joseph or what he had done. 9 He said to his people, "Look, the people of Israel now outnumber us and are stronger than we are. 10 We must make a plan to keep them from growing even more. If we don't, and if war breaks out, they will join our enemies and fight against us. Then they will escape from the country."







¹¹ So the Egyptians made the Israelites their slaves. They appointed brutal slave drivers over them, hoping to wear them down with crushing labor.


¹² But the more the Egyptians oppressed them, the more the Israelites multiplied and spread, and the more alarmed the Egyptians became.

15 Then Pharaoh, the king of Egypt, gave this order to the Hebrew midwives, Shiphrah and Puah: 16 "When you help the Hebrew women as they give birth, watch as they deliver. If the baby is a boy, kill him; if it is a girl, let her live." ¹⁷ But because the midwives feared God, they refused to obey the king's orders. They allowed the boys to live, too.







Then Pharaoh gave this order to all his people: "Throw every newborn Hebrew boy into the Nile River. But you may let the girls live."

¹ About this time, a man and woman from the tribe of Levi got married. ² The woman became pregnant and gave birth to a son. She saw that he was a special baby and kept him hidden for three months. ³ But when she could no longer hide him, she

got a basket made of papyrus reeds and waterproofed it with tar and pitch. She put the baby in the basket and laid it among the reeds along the bank of the Nile River. ⁴ The baby's sister then stood at a distance, watching to see what would happen to him.

II. The birth of Moses shows us that God is in the business of reversals.

THE BIRTH OF MOSES SHOWS US THAT GOD IS IN THE BUSINESS OF REVERSALS.

The Nile River was going to be used to bring death. God uses it to bring deliverance.



The baby who was sentenced to death, now lives.



THE BIRTH OF MOSES SHOWS US THAT GOD IS IN THE BUSINESS OF REVERSALS.

The poor slave women who had to give <u>away</u> her child is now paid to take him <u>back</u>.



THE BIRTH OF MOSES SHOWS US THAT GOD IS IN THE BUSINESS OF REVERSALS.

The child that was in peril by the hand of Pharaoh is now protected by Pharaoh's own family.



The child that was going to be a slave and peasant is now a prince.



III. What can we learn from the birth of **Moses** when we need God to bring about a reversal in our life?



God will take the wrong and make it right.



16 When he came to the village of Nazareth, his boyhood home, he went as usual to the synagogue on the Sabbath and stood up to read the Scriptures. 17 The scroll of Isaiah the prophet was handed to him. He unrolled the scroll and found the place where this was written:
